1. There is reported to be a strong fortified line along the SOMME, going E. from ABBEVILLE. The French say that it is on this line that the Germans intend to make a stand.

2. The Resistance in the area NOCE, BELLEME were very good. They picked up supplies dropped very fast and guarded them efficiently.
